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Mayor's Message

Dear Friends, Neighbors and Citizens,

Can you feel the change? No, I am not referring to the weather. Our City and the wider community will be very busy in the coming months. To kick things off, on Sunday, February 12th, at the YMCA, we will inaugurate the 1st Annual Windcrest Youth Valentine's Day Party. (Note: The YMCA is normally closed on Sunday, but they are opening it the 12th exclusively for the Windcrest community). On February 15th at 2:30 PM we will join in the ribbon cutting of the new front entrance for Rackspace. They will be unveiling an additional 300,000 square feet of renovated space. Combined with the ribbon cutting, there will be a ground breaking ceremony for the "Racker Road" project. On March 3rd, the "Firefighter Gala" will be the first of many events in our newly renovated Civic Center. Please take note that we are counting on your comments and suggestions regarding how to utilize the million-plus dollars in the newly formed Capital Improvement Project funds (CIP). To better accommodate your busy schedules, we will have Town Hall meetings (see below), to receive your inputs. March is our semi-annual brush pick-up and the city wide garage sale. April is Fiesta month and our city will host an official Fiesta event on the Rackspace grounds along with an official Fiesta Parade through our great city. In May, we have the election for positions on the City Council and the Water Board. Additionally, there are many more events being held by the many wonderful clubs and organizations in our city.

The following are some brief comments and other plans for the future:

Council: The Council has scheduled three Town Hall meetings to discuss how the CIP funds should be used. We want your input, as it is your money. It can range from putting more money into street improvements, parks, common areas, etc. or set aside to increase the rainy day fund. The Council also formed a Street Committee headed by Councilpersons Jim Shelton and Gerd Jacobi along with two citizens. Call and email Mr. Shelton or Mr. Jacobi with your thoughts. The Town Hall meetings are open to the public and we have scheduled them to help ensure maximum attendance. There will be two evening meetings for those who prefer to attend after work and one during the day for those who have commitments in the evening. All of the meetings will be held at City Hall in the Council Chambers. The dates and times are as follows: **February 13th** from 7-9 PM, **March 12th** from 2-4 PM and **March 26th** from 7-9 PM. We hope to see you there and participating. If for any reason you cannot attend any of the meetings, please email me your thoughts and ideas.

Administration: By the time you receive this, there will be (hopefully) two more employees added to the team. One will be the newly created PR/Marketing/Public Affairs/Event Coordinator, and the second will be new EDC Director. We all look forward to meeting these new hires and benefitting from the fruits of their labor.

Parks and Recreation: This committee is empowered and is working with a healthy budget. These volunteers are meeting several times a month for the betterment of us all. The renovations to the Civic Center that they are coordinating and planning are underway. There are more projects on the horizon. As we promised, the Takas Park pond will receive a long overdue makeover. There is more good news; because of the efforts of City Manager Rafael Castillo and City Engineer Jim Bray, the contractors that are building Racker Road are going to dig out and clean up the Takas Park pond at no cost to the city. While there will still be some costs

associated with this project, these costs are greatly reduced due to their collective efforts. The Parks and Recreation Committee will oversee this project and plan to “spruce up” the pond to its early grandeur. For a quick preview, check out the pond on Hole #5 at the Windcrest Golf Course. I am confident we are all looking forward to this much needed make over.

Economic Development:

I. RACKSPACE – The ground breaking ceremony for Racker Road combined with ribbon cutting and grand opening of the newly finished front entrance will be held Wednesday, February 15th at 2:30 PM at Rackspace headquarters on Walzem Road. These new spaces will provide for approximately 1000 more employees to move into the Rackspace headquarters –that they call “The Castle.” All Windcrest residents are invited and encouraged to attend this event. There will be presentations, and after the ceremony, Rackspace invites the public on guided tours of the facility. Come be a part of this historic event and see the inside of one of the fastest growing and most innovative companies in the United States. Yes, this is all happening here in Windcrest!

II. Whitestone REIT/Windsor Park Center – As I mentioned in our last newsletter, Whitestone REIT had plans to invest approximately \$1 million dollars into the mall on Fourwinds Drive. I stand corrected! We met with them last week and they advised us that they have plans to invest over \$3.5 million into this mall, and within the next twelve months they already have contracts which show that it will be over 90% leased. Additionally, Whitestone REIT is a sponsor of our Firefighter Gala and Picnic – thank you.

III. Stratford Land – This company has purchased the note for the 111 acres of land in the annexed portion of Windcrest. It is the raw land at the corner of Eisenhower and IH 35. They will be in the process closing on this land soon. They are developing usage plans, and are currently sharing their ideas with the city. In the near future, they will make presentations to the City Council and the EDC. As these developments come to fruition, our city will see an increase in tax revenue – both ad valorem and sales taxes.

IV. Tri-fold Committee – Formed by the EDC, this committee is comprised of EDC member Sue Alexander, Dennis Dooley, James McFall and Loveta Cummings. As discussed in earlier articles, we have a need for first class marketing materials for our city. This Committee has stepped up to the task. They meet several times a month. The current tri-fold marketing piece will be revised into a gate fold. I have seen the rough draft, it is impressive and you will be proud of their work. It should be completed by the end of February.

Newsletter Committee: This committee meets every Wednesday at

6 PM at City Hall. They not only meet to go over the Newsletter, but also they have helped organize and coordinate other events, such as the flag party. They are also coordinating and planning the Youth Valentine Party, and are instrumental with organizing the Gala with the support and confidence of the WVFD. I wanted to take some time to recognize these individuals, as I receive many emails asking for their names so that you can send “thank you” notes. We have several additional volunteers that attend meetings on a sporadic basis, but I would like to recognize the following as the ones who attend virtually every (some every) meeting. (Gosh, I hope I do not forget someone!), Joanne Anderson, Sue Moore, Henry Berman, Carolyn Freeman, Rita Davis, Heather Weidenbach, Ruth Fritz, Gail Baker, Barbara Lindell, Alice Briones-Ditmer, Rachael Downey, Mercedes Zamudio and myself. This committee is open to the public and we hope more will join, as there is a lot to do – by continuously improving the Newsletter and organizing community events.

Courts: The staff continues to strive for improvement and to be more efficient. Within the next 60 days, there will be user friendly online payment options for persons with fines or tickets. This should help reduce crowding at City Hall during court days, and also provide people with warrants a way to pay their fine without the fear that they would be arrested when they come in to pay. Additionally, please give Kelly Rodriguez, our Court Administrator, a thank you as she was instrumental with the city receiving a grant for over \$40,000 for new air conditioners!

Light-up: This is the biggest event in our city. We are the “City of Lights” and are recognized around the world for our light-up. It also provides a means to fundraise via Fill the Boot. We should give Windcrest sized hugs to the Women’s Club for keeping this wonderful tradition alive; our employees who work extra hours for setting up for the various events and decorating; our Police and Public Works for working on the traffic situation during Light-up; Public Works for decorating around town; our Finance Department for staying on top of the budgets and assisting with the Light-up Party; City Administration for setting up the parties and assisting in organizing the various activities; the EDC and Council for providing the largest Light up budget in our history, but the biggest hugs of all go to all the citizens who took the time to decorate their houses and their supportive neighbors. *Without you, the citizens, there would be no Light-up!* An extra big hug to the winners. We all appreciate you going the extra mile.

Again, thank you for your time, confidence and comments. I look forward to your input. As you know, I answer every email and phone call.

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

I'm still working on the Purchasing Policy, as I described in my last month's Newsletter article. This month a citizen brought a concern to me regarding the City's intermittent tree trimming contractors. As a result, I will be proposing (as part of our Purchasing Policy), that the City advertise an invitation for contractors to submit a request that their company to be placed on a City Contractor's Bidder's List. The process should be open to all contractors for the various types of work the City might need. An effort to check the qualifications and history of these contractors will be made before placing them on the list.

To help citizens meet each other one-on-one, I'm organizing a monthly "Dinner for Eight" activity. Attached to this article is a form you can fill out if you would like your name to be placed in the hat. Groups of four couples will be drawn. The Host couple will open their home to the other 3 couples who will each provide a part of the meal – salad, vegetable or dessert. Work will begin shortly to deepen and enlarge the pond at Takas Park. Once done, this will be another asset in the Park for the enjoyment of all residents.

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

Dear Windcrest Residents,

Here is a little known fact; the City of Windcrest has a City Ordinance pertaining to Alley Maintenance in Chapter 24, which states property owners and residents are responsible for keeping the alley adjacent to their home clean and maintained, free of any litter, weeds and debris. If you have an alley behind your home, as an owner or resident you are responsible for maintaining the portion between your property line to the center of the alley.

Keeping up with the general maintenance and upkeep is an asset to our community and by maintaining the structures and landscaping in your portion of the alley will help ensure the overall aesthetics of your neighborhood and while dedicating a few minutes of your time will help insure a safe passage way for any utility or emergency vehicles. When you're taking out the trash or doing your regular yard maintenance, take a look around. If you notice debris, weeds or overgrown trees, you can take care of the quick things on the spot and make a note to tackle the bigger stuff later. This will insure you won't get any unwanted critters roaming around.

Please note the correction from the November newsletter regarding the misinformation printed: The Public Works Department does not remove wild grown trees, bushes and shrubs from the alleys.

We the police would like your assistance in being better able to serve you and the community. When Emergency Services, Police, Fire, EMS respond to your home, sometimes, based on the type of call, emergency responders arrive at the back of the home in the alley or service driveway. When we are in the back of the home it is often difficult to see if we are at the proper location.

Please refer to the city ordinance Chapter 24 Maintaining Alleys and Drains.

If you have an alleyway which you use for vehicle garage access to your home, we ask that you place 2" house numbers above your garage or somewhere on the back of the home where the address numbers are easily visible. If you have only a service alleyway please place 2" house numbers on a plaque and attached it to the backyard fence of the home.

ALLEY MAINTENANCE AND PROJECTIONS
Sec. 24.202
RESPONSIBILITY FOR ALLEY MAINTENANCE


The owner and the resident of property adjacent to an alley are jointly responsible for maintaining the necessary clearances of alleys in a passable, slightly and sanitary condition.

Also when at home, please keep your garage door closed. It only takes a moment for a thief to see your open garage, enter and take something of value from the garage. If you need more Crime Prevention tips or a Home Security Survey for a Home Insurance Reduction please call the Windcrest Police Department at 210-655-2666 to schedule an appointment. All surveys are done at no charge to the resident. All insurance premium reductions are accepted by any home insurance provider who does business in the State of Texas.

SHRUBBERY, VEGETATION AND TREE HEIGHT ALONG ALLEYS

It shall be unlawful for the owner and occupant of property abutting an alley to permit any shrubbery, other vegetation, brush or tree limbs to restrict the passageway of any vehicles along alleys. Clearances for tree limbs over alleys cannot be less than thirteen feet, six inches (13'6").

The Public Works Dept. will continue to repair the ruts in the alleys as weather permits.

Online Payments



Tips for the Road

Kids Korner Friends,

Welcome once again to our little Korner of Windcrest. We can't believe that we have been doing the Kids Korner article for over 6 months now. We have had some great times learning about our community and finding ways kids can help make Windcrest a great place to live.

We are currently working on a family Scouting project for being prepared in an emergency. We are putting together backpacks with items that we may need if we have to leave our home in an emergency. Please join us and be prepared too.

These backpacks have emergency items and food to help us survive for at least 72 hours (3 days). Using a backpack makes it easy for us to grab and carry. Even small kids can have a backpack with some of their items.



A backpack with rollers can be useful

Here are some ideas for 72 hour kit supplies:

- Prescription drugs taken regularly
- Flashlight with extra batteries
- Portable, battery-operated radio
- Waterproof matches
- Long/burning candles or lanterns
- Kerosene-type lamp with extra fuel
- Fire extinguisher
- Electrical fuses (if needed)
- Strong rope
- Emergency poncho
- Hand/body warmers
- Blankets and sheets
- Water (3 gallons per person)
- Clothing (warm and cool for each person)
- Tools
- Whistle with lanyard
- Non-perishable foods (enough for 3 days)
- Vitamins
- Can opener (hand operated)
- Duct tape
- Towel
- Storable treats and snacks
- Pocketknife
- Cash and photocopies of ID, birth certificates and other important documents

You only need one of most of the above items. Pack clothes, bedding and food for each person.

Keep the backpacks near an outside door. (rolling coolers are great too)

Designate an emergency meeting place.

- Items for child's backpack:
- Jacket (hat and gloves if cold weather)
 - sweater / sweatshirt
 - 2 pairs of socks
 - change of undergarments
 - small blanket
 - coloring book and crayons
 - writing pads with pencils
 - reading books
 - small stuffed animal (for stress relief)
 - a favorite toy
 - personal flashlight extra batteries

- Zip-top bag items for backpack:
- tooth paste and a toothbrush
 - lotion
 - shampoo and conditioner
 - moist towelettes
 - first aid supplies (and instructions)
 - sterile swabs to clean cuts and/or wounds
 - bandages (variety of sizes)
 - pocket size kleenex's
 - soap / sanitizer
 - nail file / clippers
 - safety pins in variety of sizes

Additional items for a baby:

- pacifier
- formula
- diapers and wipes
- extra set of clothing
- warm socks

Add your own personal items as needed.

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ANNUAL CITY-WIDE GARAGE SALE & Spring Brush Clean Up

The Annual City Wide Garage Sale for 2012 is scheduled for March 22nd, 23rd, 24th and 25th (Thursday – Sunday) from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. No permits will be required for the garage sale, but you must register with City Administration by March 20th.

March 26th through March 30th, 2012 is scheduled for the annual curbside Spring Clean-Up. Curbside (not alley) pickup of brush, tree trimmings and large items will be provided. Allied Waste will have special trucks throughout the City picking up these items. **The truck will only go down each street one time during this week.** To ensure your items are picked up, you must have all items along curbside (not alley) by 7:00 a.m. on Monday, March 26th. **Please do not put your items under low hanging branches or your items may not be picked up.** Examples of large items are hot water heaters, bicycles, lawn mowers, barbecue pits, mattresses, etc. No bricks, concrete or rocks.

Dumpsters will be provided Saturday, March 31, 2012 for the disposal of items which were not placed along curbside. The dumpsters will be placed in the vacant lot just south of the RV storage facility on Jim Seal. The City & BFI (Allied Waste) ask that no tires, batteries, items, with lead acid, paint, pesticides, oil filters or oil be placed along curbside or disposed of in these bins.

No appliances containing chlorofluorocarbon (CFC) refrigerants can be disposed of unless the refrigerant and/or refrigerant housing has been removed by a licensed technician & verification or certification has been attached to the appliance. The City asks for your cooperation in the disposal of items during the Spring Clean-Up.

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Beware of Oak Wilt Disease

At the invitation of Mayor Alan Baxter, some notes on the seriousness of keeping Oak Wilt disease out of Windcrest:

Early pioneers to central Texas noted "Oak Decline," the invasive and often fatal plant virus now known as Oak Wilt. Once introduced into Red Oaks, Live Oaks, and Spanish Oaks, the virus multiplies rapidly in the pulp (water carrying center) to the extent the tree is unable to feed itself. Bur Oaks, White Oaks, Chinkapin, and other new patented or hybrid oaks are less affected.

Oak Wilt gained media attention 12 to 15 years ago as heritage (250 yrs +) Live Oaks died in Austin. Contaminated firewood from diseased trees and sap feeding insects were blamed (and still are a source), but contaminated cutting tools used by unlicensed, uncaring, or untrained workers are a huge problem. The virus easily travels by interlocking root systems and can devastate large areas (i.e., Hwy 281N around Marble Falls, IH10 Boerne to Junction). Trenching to 4 foot depth is necessary to control many spreads

Incubation and visible damage to Oaks range from a few weeks to 18 months. Early symptoms include leaf curl and rust-colored

veins on back of leaves, loss of leaves in spot areas, cracked and split bark with weeping and fruity smell, or swelling and discoloration of circular bark patches. Treatment in early stages is available, but is costly and somewhat ineffective (60% + or -). Cut-downs and certified disposal are also expensive, as is replacement. Uninsured, unidentified, and untraceable door-to-door solicitors are a real threat to personal safety and property value protection.

No confirmed cases of Oak Wilt have been reported in Windcrest, but San Antonio, Garden Ridge, Universal City, and other nearby municipalities have had that bad experience.

Bonded tree companies are plentiful in our area and are frequently competitive in price to the "hack and stackers." The soft economy makes it tempting to cut a few corners, but this practice is a risky area to compromise. City Hall plans a bid list of contractors known to and approved by the City of Windcrest or its citizens. I am proud to be included as are other tree contractors who want to protect ourselves and our customers.

RATE INCREASES. The Board of Directors will be considering rate increases in three areas of our rate structure at the February 16th and March 15th Board meetings. As you probably saw in the San Antonio Express News and on local television/radio, the San Antonio Water System recently received approval to raise the wholesale wastewater rates they charge us by 13.7%. The Board will be considering an increase of 13.5%. You've also seen that the Edwards Aquifer Authority is increasing the Management Fee they charge us from \$63,388 to \$188,538 (that is not a misprint). We have not received the official notice of their intentions, but it is only a matter of time. And finally, we are working on a small increase in our Winter Water Rate structure. If you use less than 30 ccf (22,450 gallons) of water per month, it will not affect you. Above 30 ccf, the increase will average about \$1.00/month.

ANNUAL SEWER AVERAGING HAS STARTED. By the time you receive this, we will be in the final stages of sewer averaging; we will take the final readings starting on February 19th and finish on February 22nd. This article is being written in early January, so it is hard to forecast what will happen in the next 45 days. If we don't get any rain, you will be fighting the temptation to irrigate your lawn. Fight the notion. Even if it doesn't rain, your lawn will survive until early March with very little rain. The odds are we will get some.

RAINFALL. We received 4.03 inches of rainfall in December for a total of 19.04 inches in 2011.
